Collective Nouns

3 min

They represent a group and are generally used in the singular form and followed by a verb in the singular. Sometimes, however, they can be in the singular followed by a verb in the plural, in order to insist on the individuals in the group rather than on the group as a whole; in this case, the pronoun would be 'they'.

Examples:

All of the *staff* were very polite. *They* were also helpful. The *audience* don't seem to enjoy *themselves*.

My *family* are not coming this year.
