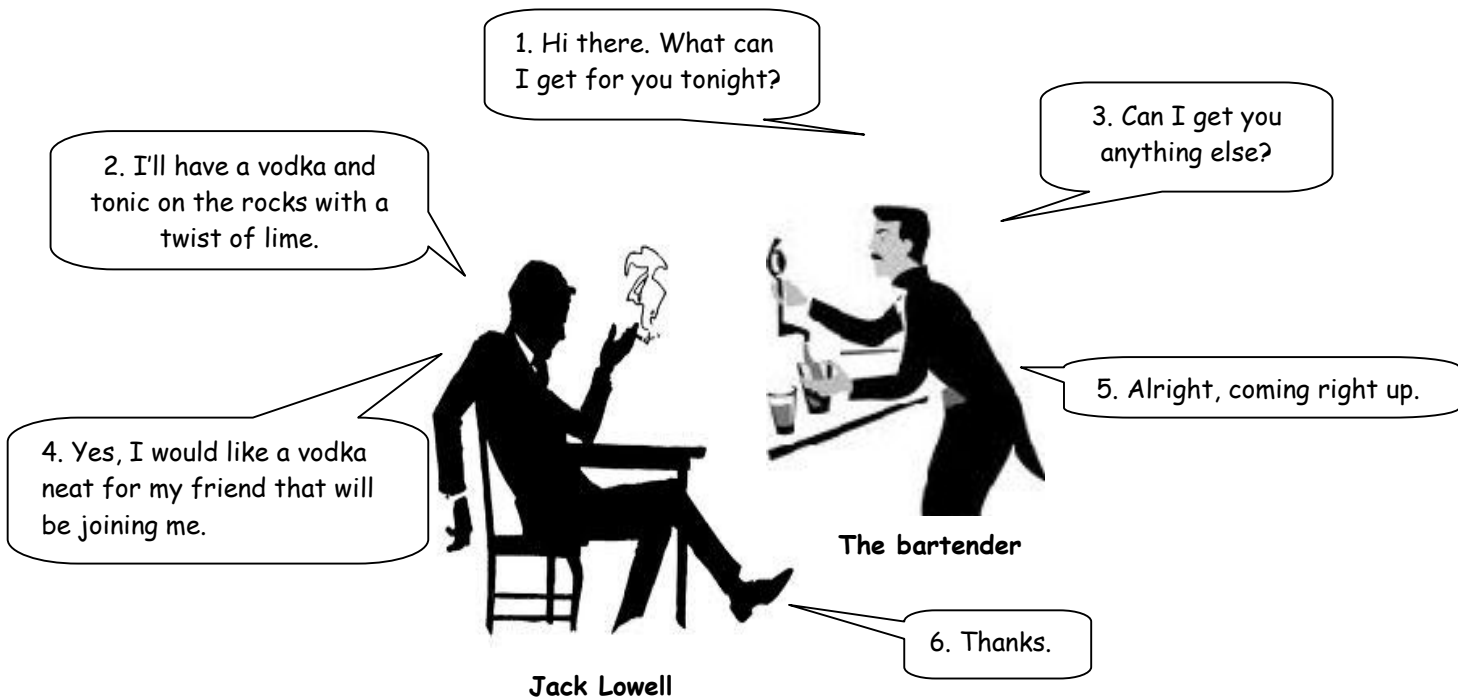


**GOING OUT**
