


GOING OUT (05)

At the movies (04) - Asking where the movie theater is (4)

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In context:

What is happening?

Peter is looking for the theater where the movie he came to see will be playing. He is asking the usher for help.

Vocabulary:

1. Concession stand - a place that sells food
2. Thanks a lot - an informal way to say thank you
3. I appreciate your help - a formal way to show thanks
4. If you can't find it - a conditional statement used to let the person know, that there is a possibility you may not find the theater, in that situation, ask someone else.
5. Usher - a person who works at a movie theater.

Language tip

In American English, the place to watch movies is called the "theater." It is spelled with the "e" before the "r."

In other countries, a place to watch movies is called a "Cinema" or a "theatre." It is spelled with the "e" after the "r."


Review the conversation below.


