
GOING OUT (05) At the movies (04) - Buying tickets (2)

What are they doing?

The Smith family is buying tickets for a movie.

Language tip 1-2 minutes

Remember that "child" is singular. If you want *more than one* "child's ticket," use "child" in its plural form, "children."

Example: I need two children's tickets.
